FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

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At Jefferson Elementary School, we believe all children can learn. To ensure that children reach their potential, we maintain high expectations and promote academic excellence for all students; create and support a school environment in which all children and adults are welcomed, respected, trusted, safe, and an important part of the school; create a collaborative environment where we can learn together and support each other; and foster a positive school climate of a caring community that respects and values diversity.

Jefferson Elementary School joined the Response to Intervention project during the 2014-15 school year. This project has helped the staff at Jefferson Elementary School implement systems that will improve targeted, effective instruction to meet the needs of all students. Our current focus is on literacy and the use of evidenced-based instructional practices. Intervention and enrichment time outside of the core academic areas will be set aside to address the specific needs of all students in reading and math.

Teams of teachers and support staff meet weekly to look at assessment data, identify student learning needs, and plan classroom instruction, interventions, and enrichment to increase academic achievement for all students. Periodic and timely assessments

are administered to monitor student growth and to help plan for instruction. Strong student and staff relationships are being established, which has been proven to help with academic growth.

Even though Jefferson Elementary School students fall below the state average in English language arts and mathematics in the percentage of students meeting standard, we rose above the state average in the percentage of students exceeding standard in both academic areas based on the assessment results from the new college and career readiness assessments.

Our focus has been, and will continue to be, meeting the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs of all students. You can help by monitoring student homework and providing a quiet place and time for homework, reading with your student at least 15 minutes daily, and/or providing a time for the whole family to read together, attending parent teacher conferences, having timely and consistent communication with your child's teacher, and volunteering. Jefferson Elementary School staff look forward to partnering with you over the coming year to make sure all of our students show growth as they reach their potential.

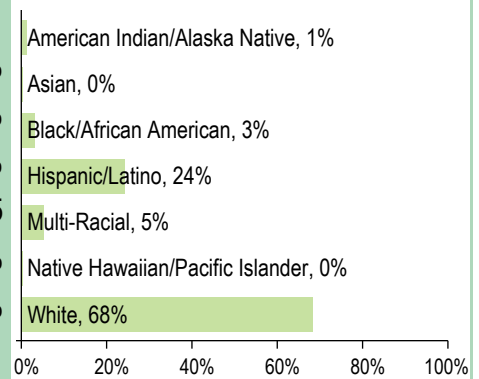
