**Principals Report:** (Mrs. Keifer)

- Introduced new staff member Joanna Sepulveda
- Talked about introducing diversity during Pride Assemblies throughout the school year.
- Would like to put on a family talent night sometime in the spring.
- Talked about Self Manager day that is celebrated 4 times throughout the school year for all students who have maintained self-manager status and asked for volunteers.
- Passed around a sign-up sheet for many events throughout the school year where volunteers will be needed.
- Introduced Michael from the SMART reading program.

**SMART:** Michael from the SMART Start Making A Readers Today reading program

- This will be the 1<sup>st</sup> year of SMART at JES
- This is the 25<sup>th</sup> year of offering a reading program
- Kids that will be in the SMART program will receive 2 books to bring home with them
- Volunteers are needed to make the SMART program at JES a success. Volunteers will work with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> graders on Tuesdays 12:45 – 2pm for only an hour of this time.
- The SMART program will begin the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Oct. till the middle of May.
- Jim will be the sight coordinator for JES.

**Jefferson Public Library:** Katherine Pitman from the Jefferson Library talked about an after school program that will be offered at the Jefferson Public Library Tues-Thurs until 6 pm. Kids will have time to work on any homework they may, play computer games, read, color, do crafts and be with friends.

**School Bond:** Paul Terjeson talked about the School Bond and how it has been revised and will be on the November ballot. The revisions are a different type of building called Dome Construction, this type of construction is cost effective and exceeds health and safety standards. The new bond will only be asking for \$16 million and would still qualify for a grant that would match up to \$4 million. The taxes would then be under \$1.50 per \$100,000 assessed value of your home.

**Treasurer Report:** \$6,862.17 in the PTC account – there is \$1250.00 encumbered for POs this year. So far there are 4 people with P.O.'s

- A request for \$399 for 3 bathroom faucets has been made. These are faucets on a timer that will help to prevent flooding when/if paper towels are left in the sink. PTC approved this request.

- A request for \$400 has been made for P.E. equipment. (Scholastic money can be used to purchase P.E. equipment) Mrs. Keifer will see about using the Scholastic money that will expire on Oct. 3<sup>rd</sup> for this. PTC approved a request to fund \$400 out of the PTC account as well for PE equipment.

**Burgerville:** (Fair) This fall we will have our first Burgerville partnership night on 10/25 from 5-8pm. Hoping to have an awesome turn out again this year!

**Box Tops & Campbell's Soup:** (Emily) The first collection date will be the last week in October. Please cut them if possible and place them in Ziploc bags, this makes it easier to count on the backend. July 2017 is the last month Campbell's will accept soup labels – so round them up!

**Social Media:** (Myya) PTC has a Facebook page @JESPTC, Myya and Emily will maintain this page and update it with PTC info, school closures, pride wear information, along with other school info.

**Book Fair:** (Ashley & Jessica) Book Fair will be held Sept. 26-30 and the theme will be Bookaneers (Pirate themed) The book fair will be open 1 hour before Open House on the 29<sup>th</sup>. Many volunteers are needed to keep the book fair running smoothly, if you would like to sign up to volunteer there is a sign-up sheet located at the office. Our Scholastic book fair balance is \$4,442.56.

**Tooth Taxi:** (Melissa) Tooth Taxi will be here the week of 10/24. Melissa is the site coordinator and will work with the front office in identifying students in need of dental work. We are in need of volunteers for this event, if you are able to assist please let the front office or PTC know. Since the Tooth Taxi launched in late fall 2008 they have visited over 346 schools/sites all over the State of Oregon, and served over 18,000 children while delivering over 5.5 million dollars in donated dental services. The Tooth Taxi is a 38' state-of-the-art dental office on wheels with two dental chairs and a full-time dentist and staff. It visits schools throughout Oregon to provide free dental care and oral health education to uninsured and underserved children.

**New Business:** Kim Kopp with Kimmel Athletic Supply asked to be considered for Pride Wear. She will get some sample logos for us to look at. Kimmel can also set up an online ordering site for our school. We will be able to advertise Pride wear on the new PTC Facebook page eliminating paper flyers.
