Treasurer's Report. Angie reported about \$2,000 in the carnival account and \$3,675 (+\$1,120 of that is encumbered) in the PTC account. Shelley stated that several charges have not shown up of \$700 for 4 wireless headset microphones, \$250 for a projector, and \$60 for SLP supplies. Once those do, the PTC balance should be around: \$3785.

Music request. Mr Lake has received \$340 in donations and requests \$700 from PTC to purchase a wireless handheld mic and ipad. Approved.

Fred Meyer rewards. 9 households participating, \$39 received for last quarter. Families just link their Fred Meyer Reward card to our school and a portion of what is spent at Fred Meyer's is returned to the school. Shelley said to make sure you sign up to support Jefferson Elementary in Jefferson, not Corvallis.

Shelley presented 3 new fundraiser ideas; Scentco smelly pencils, Y-ties, and mixed bag designs—none garnered any interest from those present.

Thanksgiving dinners. In past years the PTC has approved \$200 for four Thanksgiving dinners for deserving families, this was again approved for this year.

Box Tops. Collected 6,081 this time which is \$608 for the school. Four classes brought in more than 600 box tops and will receive parties. The winning classes will be announced at the Cub Pride assembly on 11/12.

Burgerville Fundraiser. Tomorrow Night (11/5) from 5 to 8pm.

Scrip Fundraiser. Stephanie Stubbs presented a new fundraiser idea where people buy gift cards at face value but the school receives a kickback. Over 400 stores/restaurants to choose from. She will coordinate this fundraiser to happen early December.

Adopt a Staff Member. All staff were matched, let Fair know if you didn't get your bio.

New Cub Pride Design. JoAnn presented 5 new ideas, the group voted on #1, "Jefferson Elementary" with a paw. Also approved raising prices \$1 or \$2 for each item to make it a small fundraiser.

Book Fair. Total profit was \$4,773 for the two-week Book Fair. This brought in about \$2,000 in Scholastic bucks, Shelley reported.

Campbell's Soup for Education. Labels were turned in along with Box Tops. In the past, we have given those to JMS. However, they are not doing that anymore. These labels earn the school points to shop with in their catalog which includes school supplies and health and wellness items. Shelley suggested we utilize this resource again. Stephanie Stubbs offered to spearhead this.

Chair Labeling. Shelley asked for volunteers to put "JES" on the back of all the new chairs in sharpie; Mindi and Angie volunteered.

Color Run. Shelley will seek board approval for this event so it will be covered by the District's liability insurance.

Meeting dates. Shelley polled the group to find out if there is reason to move PTC meetings back to the first Monday of each month. Results are undetermined at this time and next meeting date is TBD.

Extra Helping. Shelley reported that they are phasing out the lunch program and moving people over to the food pantry, which is open once a week and serves the whole family. They can get better support from food banks for the food pantry than for lunches so will be transitioning to this and end the lunch program sometime in the spring.

Keegan's Garden. Work party scheduled for Monday, Nov. 10 from 10:30am to 2pm; pumpkin donuts provided.

Jefferson Together will be hosting a **Strengthening Families** workshop for parents and kids ages 10-14. Beginning in January, free class, free childcare, and gift cards given out for attendance. More details to come; let Shelley know if you're interested.

Michael asked the PTC to support the super self-manager program by funding snacks/prizes for the first party, tentatively planned for Nov. 26. **The PTC approved \$300 for this.**
