March 11th, 2014

Treasurer Report: \$5200.00 in the PTC account. Deposit from the candy grams was \$392.00 and there is about \$766.00 encumbered.

- **Donation to Extra Helping:** Shelley and Michael presented the check at the last packing day. They were very appreciative and sent in a thank you card.
- **Candy grams Report (Myya & Shana):** The pop rocks were a great success – they sold 392 grams which leaves about 120 left for sales in the concessions. Sales were up from last year – they expected to sell closer to 450 – 500 but the snow days slowed that down a bit.
- **Cookie dough / flower fundraiser:** Cookie dough orders will be processed the week of March 17th.

Cub Pride gear: \$1100.00 in sales – around 45 kids placed orders. They ended up dropping the lanyards, totes and window stickers off the order sheet. Thinking about selling them at concessions and they are still available in the front office.

Headstart report: Headstart is planning on doing a fundraiser which involves placing coin jars at local businesses. They are currently doing feed the monster box on the bus where kids put coins in the monsters mouth. They are working on popcorn Friday. The last day for Headstart is May 29th.

Classified Appreciation week: Superhero theme was a success!! Special thanks to this year's coordinators, Sara Withee and Melissa Palma, for all their hard work on the theme and the staff room. Fair partnered with them on behalf of the PTC. The daily themes were:

The project would involve postcard mailings, creating new events, updating and creating websites and other projects. Jefferson Proud's goals are to:

- Grow pride in Jefferson
- Foster a sense of belonging, being connected
- Show support of students, programs, staff, businesses and organizations
- Highlight positive attributes of Jefferson
